



Enter and work in confined spaces

(RIIWH5202D)



About this course

This course is offered by Just Careers Training (RTO ID 91413) trading as Licences 4 Work.

This course has been designed to impart the required knowledge and skills in order to enter and work in confined spaces.

The Safe Work Australia Code of Practice defines a "confined space" means an enclosed or partially enclosed space that:

- is not designed or intended primarily to be occupied by a person; and
- is, or is designed or intended to be, at normal atmospheric pressure while any person is in the space; and
- is or is likely to be a risk to health and safety from:
 - an atmosphere that does not have a safe oxygen level, or
 - contaminants, including airborne gases, vapours and dusts, that may cause injury from fire or explosion, or
 - harmful concentrations of any airborne contaminants, or
 - engulfment.

Examples of confined spaces include (but are not limited to):

- Storage tanks
- Tank cars
- Vessels including Pressure vessels
- Boilers
- Silos and other tank-like compartments
- Pits and degreasers
- Pipes
- Sewers and Sewer pump stations including wet and dry wells, shafts and ducts
- Shipboard spaces entered through small hatchways or access points, cargo tanks, cellular double bottom tanks, duct keels, ballast or oil tanks and void spaces

Therefore, this course is recommended for:

- Workers who will be performing confined space work, but are not required to write a permit, monitor gas levels, wear breathing apparatus
- Electrical engineers
- Safety inspectors and Safety personnel
- Injury prevention personnel
- Maintenance personnel
- Emergency services personnel (fire, ambulance, police)

- OHS officers
- Risk managers
- Mine managers
- Telecommunications and cable installation personnel
- Lift operators and installers
- Transport industry workers

This course, resulting in a Nationally Recognised Statement of Attainment includes both theory and practical components, with participants undertaking practical activities to ensure familiarity with confined spaces and the safety requirements relating to entering and working in these spaces.

What is covered in the course?

Topics covered throughout the day include:

How long is the course?

This one-day course commences at 12:30pm and finishes around 4pm. Lunch (sausage roll or vegetarian option with a bottle of water) and morning tea is provided.

Where is the course held?

The course may be organised for the workplace, however this can only take place once we have ensured that the area used for practical and theory training is safe and adequate. Who can do this course?

To participate in this course;

- You must be at least 14 years of age to do this course (you will need a guardian to sign off a permission and awareness slip if you are under 18 years old) ;
- You must present sufficient identification (between ID's you should have a Signature, Photo, Address and Date of Birth).

Assessments and tests

Attaining your Statement of Attainment for this course involves attending your course, undertaking training, completing theory and practical activities and undertaking a final assessment. You will only be permitted to undertake final assessments if you feel you are ready, and your trainer/assessor allows you to undertake assessment (and this is based on your participation and completion of activities).

Outcome

Once you have met the requirements of the course then you will be issued with a Statement of Attainment for the unit:

Confined space refresher training is recommended every 12-24 months under Australian Standard AS2865-2009.

What is involved?

Undertake pre-course study. Your course commences when you book. This will make the course content easier for you to understand on the day. Complete workbook before attending.



Attend for your scheduled training day and bring in your completed workbook. The training is for a half day. All courses commence at 12.30pm and finishes at 4:30pm.



Once you have met the requirements of the course then you will be issued with a Statement of Attainment for the unit RIIWHS204D Work Safely at heights



You may request a wallet sized card to keep in your wallet to show your current and/or future employers that you have undertaken the training required to work at heights safely (please note site and task specific inductions will still be required for working at heights)

What Do I Need to Bring?

- Your ID – 1 form of legal ID will usually suffice
- Long pants, a long sleeve shirt and closed shoes (preferably hard caps, but not compulsory)
- You will not be allowed to do the course in open shoes, skirts, or short sleeve shirts and singlet
- Lunch , if you do not want to partake in the lunch provided with this course (please contact if you have special dietary requirements and we will *try* to accommodate for your needs)
